

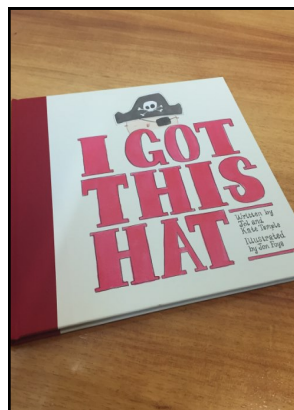

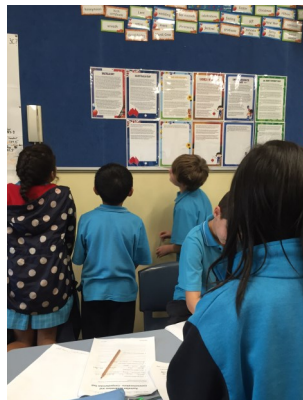


District Cross Country Results



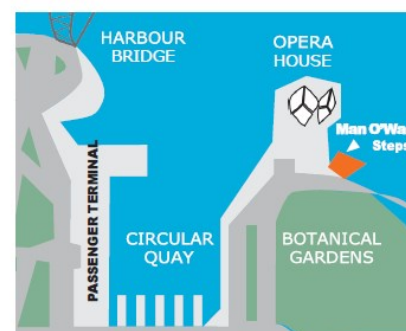
