This year we have the opportunity to reduce waste and earn money for our school. Our school will be a donation partner on a reverse vending machine. This means that all money raised through recycling of bottles at our vending machine can be identified as a donation to our school.

How it works for our school:



Peakhurst West will have our name on a reverse vending machine located at:

Club Grandviews Peakhurst - 821 Forest Road Peakhurst

Our partnership with return and earn vending machine will run for three months starting on 27th May and run through until 25th August 2019. When returning containers to the reverse vending machine just select Peakhurst West and all money will be donated to our school.

By collecting eligible drink containers. Most drinks containers between 150ml and three litres can get you a refund. They need to be in good condition (not broken or crushed), be empty and have the label attached.



Reverse vending machine

The containers can be made of:

- Glass;
- Plastic;
- Aluminium;
- Steel;
- Or liquid paperboard (cartons).

So let's do the right thing for the environment and help raise funds for our school.


Picasso Cow Project
